The Game

The Falcons play their second straight home game of the 2005 season when they host Bemidji State at 1 p.m. at Ramer Field on Saturday. Last week the Falcons opened their season with a 26-21 loss to NCAA Div. II Concordia-St. Paul. The Falcons face another NCAA Div. II team, and Northern Sun Conference member, in Bemidji State. Last year BSU crushed the Falcons, 58-14, in Bemidji. The 58 points was the most given up by a Falcon team since the 1970 season (Whitewater 58, RF 2).

River Falls - Concordia-St. Paul Recap

The Falcon football team lost their first game of the year, 26-21, to Concordia-St. Paul at Ramer Field Saturday afternoon.

UWRF opened the game with the first points capped off by Andy Kolstad's 1-yard touchdown run at 3:37 of the first quarter. The Falcons capitalized on a muffed CSP punt that was recovered by Ryan Agrimson at the CSP 19. Chris Anderson caught an 18 yards pass from quarterback Jeremy Wolff to get the Falcons to the one and Kolstad, playing halfback, scored on the next play.

CSP drove down the field after taking the kickoff and nearly scored. On a third-and-two play from the UWRF 42, halfback Brian Holmes broke free and looked like he was going to score. But Agrimson caught him from behind and forced a fumble that was recovered by Shane Hanson in the end zone.

Concordia kicker Brody Johnson kicked a 41 yard field goal in the second quarter to make the score 7-3 at halftime. CSP drove 55 yards in 13 plays to get the field goal. Falcon defensive end Jeff Cassellius sacked CSP quarterback James McNear for a 16-yard loss on a third-and-four play from the UWRF eight. CSP then settled for the field goal.

Concordia opened the second half quickly scoring on McNear's touchdown pass to Nate Harrington covering 31 yards. CSP drove 66 yards in eight plays to score.

River Falls answered right back with a 1-yard Dave Affeldt touchdown dive to give the Falcons a 15-9 lead. Matt Jordan set

up the score when he returned a CSP punt 29 yards to give the Falcons a first down at the Golden Bear 17. Wolff hit Nathan Anderson with the two-point conversion pass.

Concordia answered right back with a six play 70 yard drive capped off by Aaron Cawthorn's 15-yard run to make the score 16-15. They added a 37-yard Johnson field goal to make the score 19-15 after the third quarter.

Cawthorn scored the first touchdown of the fourth quarter from 5-yards out capping off an eight play 72 yard drive. Cawthorn finished the game with two touchdowns and 98 yards rushing.

UWRF scored once more on Anderson's 2-yard touchdown reception from Wolff. A two point conversion failed and that was all of the scoring.

Anderson led UWRF with 64 yards rushing on 17 attempts. Wolff, who rushed for 36 yards, was 8-20 passing for 140 yards and one touchdown. Josh Grover led the team with three catches for 63 yards. Jordan led the Falcons with 10 tackles. He blocked two kicks and broke up two passes. Greg Neumann had seven tackles, including two for a loss of yardage. He also recovered a fumble. Andy Acosta and Cassellius also had tackles for loss.

Bemidji State - MSU Mankato Recap

Bemidji State sophomore wide receiver Anthony Schreiber hauled in a game-high eight passes for a career-high 115 yards and a touchdown, and rushed for 14 yards and a second touchdown to help lift BSU past Minnesota State, 28-23.

Schreiber scored both of his touchdowns during a 21-point second-quarter outburst which saw the Beavers score on three consecutive possessions.

With nine seconds to play in the first quarter, Minnesota State's Kevin Adams intercepted BSU quarterback Nathan Sannes at the MSU two yard line, and the Mavericks went three-and-out on the ensuing possession and punted to give BSU the ball in Maverick territory, at the 38 yard line.

BSU needed six plays to score on the short field, with Alvaro Carvajal scoring from one yard out to put the Beavers on top, 7-3, with 11:41 to play in the second quarter.

After consecutive sacks of MSU quarterback Jamie Van Den Elzen on the next Minnesota State drive which forced a punt on 4th and 22, BSU again took over in plus territory at the Maverick 45.

BSU needed four plays to score, capped by a 20-yard touchdown run from Schreiber on a reverse. Michael McDonald's extra point was blocked, leaving BSU with a 13-3 edge. The block snapped McDonald's streak of 28 consecutive successful PAT kicks.

The Mavericks went three-and-out on their next possession, and BSU took the punt 75 yards in seven plays. Schreiber again capped off the scoring drive, hauling in a 37-yard pass from Sannes. Sannes hit tight end Dan Nagengast for the two-point conversion to put BSU on top, 21-3, with 2:39 to play in the first half.

MSU's Tyrell Smith returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown in the final seconds of the first half, but BSU's Zach Stafford blocked the PAT attempt to leave the Beavers with a 21-9 advantage heading into halftime.

Minnesota State drew within five points on a two-yard run by Sean Treasure with 30 seconds to play in the third quarter.

Tyler Olson scored from three yards out to cap a 12-play, 65-yard drive at 10:41 of the fourth quarter.

Minnesota State was held to just 87 net yards on 39 carries (2.2 yards/rush), with pre-season All-America selection Treasure held to just 42 yards on 20 carries. The Beavers were held to 98 yards rushing on 42 carries; it marked the first time BSU had been held under 100 rushing yards since Oct. 11, 2003 when Winona State held BSU to 97 net yards. Sannes led the Beavers with 47 yards on 12 carries, while Olson generated 30 yards on 17 carries with one touchdown.

UWRF At Ramer Field

The Falcons are 25-20 at Ramer Field since 1995. The Falcons last winning season at Ramer Field was in 2000, when they went 3-1. In conference play, the Falcons are 22-13 at Ramer Field since 1995, with their last winning season in 2001, when they finished 2-1. The Falcons last undefeated season at Ramer Field was in 1998, when they went 5-0 overall and 4-0 in conference play.

UWRF On The Road

The Falcons are 25-28 on the road since 1995. The Falcons last winning season on the road was in 2000, when they went 3-2 overall and 3-1 in conference play. The Falcons are 20-18 on the road in conference play since 1995. In 1999 and 2000 the Falcons finished with 3-1 records on the road in conference play.

UWRF At Neutral Sites

The Falcons are 4-1 at neutral sites since 1995. They have not played a neutral site game since 2000, when they lost to Bemidji State at the Metrodome, 23-20.

UWRF Football History

The first year of Falcon football was in 1895 when the team finished with a 2-0 record after playing and beating New Richmond High School twice. The first game against a collegiate team was in 1899 when the Falcons lost to Superior, 12-0. It wasn't until 1923 when the Falcons started playing only collegiate teams. UW-RF has won 18 WIAC titles, third most of all WIAC institutions. The Falcons have a 469-303-49 record in 103 seasons.

Head Coach John O'Grady

John O'Grady is in his 17th year as head coach at UW-RF and stands second in all-time football wins.

Under O'Grady the Falcons have compiled an 89-69-3 overall record, a winning percentage of .562. Among WIAC active coaches he is third in wins and is eighth in all-time wins of all WIAC coaches. He needs just six wins to reach the seventh spot. In WIAC play O'Grady has led the Falcons to one first place finish (1998), three second place finishes (1994, 1995, 1996) and five third place finishes (1989, 1992, 1999, 2000, 2001). He has had winning seasons in 10 of his 16 seasons with the Falcons.

Year-in and year-out the Falcons are one of the top teams in the

WIAC under the veteran coach. In 1998, the Falcons surprised most WIAC observers. The team finished 7-3 overall and 5-2 in the WIAC good for a tie for first place. In 1996 the team finished 9-2 overall and lost to La Crosse (44-0) in the first round of the playoffs. In 1995 the Falcons were 9-3 overall. The nine wins tied the school record. In the playoffs the Falcons beat Central, Iowa, (10-7) but then lost to La Crosse (28-14). In 1999 the Falcons were 6-4 and 5-2 (third place) in the WIAC.

Last season the Falcons finished a disappointing 3-7 overall and 3-4 (fifth place tie) in the WIAC. In 2003 the Falcons were 2-7 overall and 2-5 (sixth place) in league play. In 2002 UWRF was 3-7 overall and 2-5 in WIAC play (sixth place). The Falcons finished 4-5 overall and 4-3 (tie third place) in the WIAC in 2001. In 2000, the Falcons were 6-4 overall and 5-2 (third place) in the WIAC.

O'Grady was named the 1995 WIAC Coach of the Year. His teams have compiled a 59-46-3 record in WIAC play. O'Grady combines his vast football knowledge and intensity to help the Falcons succeed.

O'Grady, 52, played for the Falcons (linebacker) from 1972-75 and earned four letters. He was the team captain and voted most dedicated in 1975 when the Falcons won their first WIAC title in 18 years.

He coached for two years at Miami University of Ohio as an offensive line coach and offensive special teams coordinator. Before that, he coached at the University of Wisconsin-Madison (1985-86) as an offensive line coach and special teams coordinator, at Kent State University, Ohio, where he was offensive coordinator/offensive line and offensive special teams coordinator (1983-84), and at the University of Wisconsin as a part time assistant coach of tight ends and special teams (1981-82). He also was an assistant at UW-River Falls (1976-80) as a linebacker, secondary and special teams coach.

O'Grady played football at Sullivan High School, Chicago, Ill., from 1968-71 and was team captain, most valuable player and winner of a coach's award as a senior. He is a native of Worcester, Mass.

He earned his undergraduate degree in physical education from UW-River Falls in 1979 and his master's degree in supervision and instructional leadership from UW-RF in 1983. Besides coaching football, O'Grady teaches classes in the University's health and human performance department.

O'Grady is a firm believer in education and helps all UW-RF students in pursuit of collegiate degrees. In his career as head coach, 166 of 167 Falcon football players, who have completed four seasons of eligibility, have earned undergraduate degrees. Several have gone on to highly successful careers in education, coaching, business.

He runs three summer football camps - Wishbone, Kickers and Big O & D. About 400 participants and 75 coaches, many of them are UW-RF graduates, attend the camps each summer. The Kickers Camp has been a mainstay at UW-RF for 32 years and has had top NFL and college kickers attend as counselors. Gary Zauner, special teams coach of the Baltimore Ravens, has been a counselor for 28 years.

O'Grady is well known as a speaker and clinician throughout the midwest. He has spoken at the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association spring clinic several times and has addressed participants at the Indiana Wishbone Coaches Association clinic. He has been invited to give clinics in Wisconsin, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Indiana and Minnesota. For the past 15 years he has worked with former Falcon football player and teammate, Darryl Herrick, at a football clinic in Gilman, Wis. The clinic was established by Herrick, who is the superintendent of the Cedarburg school district, in memory of a nephew who was killed in a hunting accident.

He and wife, Jody, have three children: Lindsey, 24, Jaclyn, 21 and Logan 18. Lindsey, a UW-RF graduate, teaches social studies and coaches volleyball and track & field at the Mauston middle school. Jaclyn is a senior at the University of Minnesota and will graduate in December, 2005 with a degree in film studies. She plans on going to graduate school. Logan will be a freshman at the University of St. Thomas this fall and will compete in cross country and track & field.

Last Season

BSU 58, UWRF 14

The Falcon football team fell behind 38-7 at the half and lost a 58-14 decision at Bemidji State on Saturday afternoon.

BSU led 7-0 at the end of the first quarter and 51-7 at the end of three quarters.

Trailing 17-0, the Falcons got on the scoreboard when halfback John Peterlik scored on a 21-yard run with 9:11 to go in the first half.

Spasimir Bodurski added the point after. UWRF drove 70 yards in just five plays with the big play in the drive a 32-yard pass complete from quarterback Andy Kolstad to halfback Jeremy Wolff. That play gave the Falcons a first down at the BSU 21. On the next play Peterlik scored. The drive took just 1:28 off the clock.

BSU came back to score 21 points before the end of the half to take a 38-7 lead into the locker room.

The Beavers added two more touchdowns in the third quarter, and one in the fourth, before the Falcon scored again. On the last play of the game, Kolstad hit Wolff with a 21-yard pass play for the final points of the game.

Peterlik led the Falcon rushing attack with 82 yards on 15 carries. Wolff added 32 yards. The Falcons finished with 178 rushing yards. Kolstad was 2-4 passing for 53 yards and the one TD. For BSU, Alvaro Carvajal rushed for 138 yards and scored three touchdowns. Tyler Olson rushed for 84 yards and also scored three times. Quarterback Nathan Saanes was 10-13 passing for 171 yards and one score. Mike Nordyke led the BSU receivers with six catches for 101 yards and one touchdown.

Ben Gillett led the Falcon defense with five solo and 12 total tackles. Matt Jordan, O'Neal Hampton, Josh Meyer and Nate Gray all had seven tackles. Dan Buker came up with the only turnover, recovering a BSU fumble.

The 58 points is the most given up by a Falcon team since a 58-2 loss to Whitewater in the 1970 season.
