The Game

The Falcons play their third straight home game on Saturday when they host Pacific Lutheran at Ramer Field. PLU will be the first NCAA Div. III team the Falcons will have played in 2005. The Falcons have already played two NCAA Div. II teams - Concordia-St. Paul and Bemidji State. The two teams have played only once before - on Sept. 25, 2004 - PLU took a 28-24 win at Sparks Stadium.

River Falls - Bemidji State Recap

The Falcon football team lost their second game of the year, 35-19, to Bemidji State at Ramer Field Saturday afternoon.

BSU started the game quickly, scoring on their first offensive play with an 80-yard Nathan Sannes to Johnathan Hawks pass. After a Matt Jordan blocked punt at the BSU 15, the Falcons scored three plays later on Nathan Anderson's 1-yard touchdown run at 4:24 to make the score 7-7 after the first quarter.

RF opened the second quarter scoring first on Jeremy Wolff's 52-yard touchdown run at 9:07 to make the score 13-7, after a Dan Keller missed extra point. After a Jovin Kroll fumbled the snap on a punt attempt, BSU took over at the Falcons 43. Five plays later Sannes connected for another touchdown pass, this time to Chad Christianson, covering 10 yards to make the score 14-13 BSU at halftime.

BSU scored the only points of the third quarter on another Sannes pass this time to Tony Schreiber covering 50 yards at :52. The score after the third quarter was 21-13 BSU.

RF scored the first points of the fourth quarter taking the ball 75 yards in six plays capped off by Wolff's 53-yard touchdown run. The two point conversion failed. Wolff finished the day racking up 162 yards on the ground and 119 yards passing. Anderson also rushed for more than 100 yards racking up 115 yards on 30 carries along with one touchdown.

Sannes marched his team right back down the field on the very next possession. BSU covered 68 yards in six plays. Sannes threw his last of four touchdown passes, this time Schreiber, covering 10 yards at 10:57. Schreiber scored the last points of the game scoring on an 18-yard run capping off an 11-play 87-yard drive to end the scoring. Schreiber ended the day with six catches for 121 yards and two touchdowns. Sannes passed for 287 yards and four touchdowns along with one interception.

Falcon linebacker Tony Dorner led the Falcon defense with four solo and eight total tackles. Aaron Retzlaff (4-2), Andy Acosta (3-3) and Mike Larson (3-3) all had six tackles. Gregg Neumann and Jeff Cassellius combined for a sack and Neumann had two quarterback hurries.

Pacific Lutheran - California Lutheran Recap

California Lutheran scored back-to-back touchdowns in a 5:11 span of the second half, propelling the Kingsmen to a 42-35 victory over Pacific Lutheran in the season opener for both teams at Mt. Clef Stadium on Sept. 10.

A 42-yard touchdown pass from Danny Jones to Kellan Mayberry with 2:10 left in the third quarter broke a 28-28 tie. In the fourth quarter, the Kingsmen recovered a fumble at the PLU 35 yard line and took four plays to score. Charlie Brown's 2 yard carry with 11:59 remaining gave CLU a 42-28 advantage.

The Lutes rallied on Chris Maine's 15-yard scoring pass to Brian Stevens with 4:09 left in the game, but the Kingsmen ran out the clock to claim the victory.

The win snapped a seven-game PLU win streak in the all-time series.

Matt Sagraves gave CLU a 7-0 lead when he intercepted a pass and returned in 16 yards for the score in the first minute of the game. The Lutes knotted the score on Maine's 9-yard pass to Craig Chiado.

Cal Lutheran scored on Danny Jones' touchdown passes of 13 yards to Brown and 46 yards to Tyler Williams for a 21-7 advantage. The Lutes pulled to within seven on Maine's 9-yard TD pass to Chad Averill with 1:35 left in the first half.

The Kingsmen followed with a five play, 60 yard drive that ended with Jones' 16 yard pass to Kellen Mayberry. The touchdown with 26 seconds left put CLU in front 28-14.

Chiado caught a 21 yard touchdown pass from Maine with 13:14 on the clock in the third quarter, and Maine threw a 33-yard TD pass to Chase Reed with 4:19 remaining in the stanza to tie the score.

Maine was 19-of-36 for 249 yards and five touchdowns and one interception. He also was the leading ground gainer with 70 yards on 11 carries. Chiado had six catches for 82 yards and two touchdowns.

The Lute defense was led by Kurt Van Selus, who had seven solo and three assisted tackles, recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass.

For Cal Lutheran, Jones completed 19-25 passes for 250 yards, with four touchdowns and one interception. Mayberry had five receptions for 115 yards and Brown led the running game with 77 yards on 11 carries.

UWRF At Ramer Field

The Falcons are 25-21 at Ramer Field since 1995. The Falcons last winning season at Ramer Field was in 2000, when they went 3-1. In conference play, the Falcons are 22-13 at Ramer Field since 1995, with their last winning season in 2001, when they finished 2-1. The Falcons last undefeated season at Ramer Field was in 1998, when they went 5-0 overall and 4-0 in conference play.

UWRF On The Road

The Falcons are 25-28 on the road since 1995. The Falcons last winning season on the road was in 2000, when they went 3-2 overall and 3-1 in conference play. The Falcons are 20-18 on the road in conference play since 1995. In 1999 and 2000 the Falcons finished with 3-1 records on the road in conference play.

UWRF At Neutral Sites

The Falcons are 4-1 at neutral sites since 1995. They have not played a neutral site game since 2000, when they lost to Bemidji State at the Metrodome, 23-20.

UWRF Football History

The first year of Falcon football was in 1895 when the team finished with a 2-0 record after playing and beating New Richmond High School twice. The first game against a collegiate team was in 1899 when the Falcons lost to Superior, 12-0. It wasn't until 1923 when the Falcons started playing only collegiate teams. UW-RF has won 18 WIAC titles, third most of all WIAC institutions. The Falcons have a 469-303-49 record in 103 seasons.

Head Coach John O'Grady

John O'Grady is in his 17th year as head coach at UW-RF and stands second in all-time football wins.

Under O'Grady the Falcons have compiled an 89-70-3 overall record, a winning percentage of .558. Among WIAC active coaches he is third in wins and is eighth in all-time wins of all WIAC coaches. He needs just six wins to reach the seventh spot. In WIAC play O'Grady has led the Falcons to one first place finish (1998), three second place finishes (1994, 1995, 1996) and five third place finishes (1989, 1992, 1999, 2000, 2001). He has had winning seasons in 10 of his 16 seasons with the Falcons.

WIAC under the veteran coach. In 1998, the Falcons surprised most WIAC observers. The team finished 7-3 overall and 5-2 in the WIAC good for a tie for first place. In 1996 the team finished 9-2 overall and lost to La Crosse (44-0) in the first round of the playoffs. In 1995 the Falcons were 9-3 overall. The nine wins tied the school record. In the playoffs the Falcons beat Central, Iowa, (10-7) but then lost to La Crosse (28-14). In 1999 the Falcons were 6-4 and 5-2 (third place) in the WIAC.

Last season the Falcons finished a disappointing 3-7 overall and 3-4 (fifth place tie) in the WIAC. In 2003 the Falcons were 2-7 overall and 2-5 (sixth place) in league play. In 2002 UWRF was 3-7 overall and 2-5 in WIAC play (sixth place). The Falcons finished 4-5 overall and 4-3 (tie third place) in the WIAC in 2001. In 2000, the Falcons were 6-4 overall and 5-2 (third place) in the WIAC.

O'Grady was named the 1995 WIAC Coach of the Year. His teams have compiled a 59-46-3 record in WIAC play. O'Grady combines his vast football knowledge and intensity to help the Falcons succeed.

O'Grady, 52, played for the Falcons (linebacker) from 1972-75 and earned four letters. He was the team captain and voted most dedicated in 1975 when the Falcons won their first WIAC title in 18 years.

He coached for two years at Miami University of Ohio as an offensive line coach and offensive special teams coordinator. Before that, he coached at the University of Wisconsin-Madison (1985-86) as an offensive line coach and special teams coordinator, at Kent State University, Ohio, where he was offensive coordinator/offensive line and offensive special teams coordinator (1983-84), and at the University of Wisconsin as a part time assistant coach of tight ends and special teams (1981-82). He also was an assistant at UW-River Falls (1976-80) as a linebacker, secondary and special teams coach.

O'Grady played football at Sullivan High School, Chicago, Ill., from 1968-71 and was team captain, most valuable player and winner of a coach's award as a senior. He is a native of Worcester, Mass.

He earned his undergraduate degree in physical education from UW-River Falls in 1979 and his master's degree in supervision and instructional leadership from UW-RF in 1983. Besides coaching football, O'Grady teaches classes in the University's health and human performance department.

O'Grady is a firm believer in education and helps all UW-RF students in pursuit of collegiate degrees. In his career as head coach, 166 of 167 Falcon football players, who have completed four seasons of eligibility, have earned undergraduate degrees. Several have gone on to highly successful careers in education, coaching, business.

He runs three summer football camps - Wishbone, Kickers and Big O & D. About 400 participants and 75 coaches, many of them are UW-RF graduates, attend the camps each summer. The Kickers Camp has been a mainstay at UW-RF for 32 years and has had top NFL and college kickers attend as counselors. Gary Zauner, special teams coach of the Baltimore Ravens, has been a counselor for 28 years.

O'Grady is well known as a speaker and clinician throughout the midwest. He has spoken at the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association spring clinic several times and has addressed participants at the Indiana Wishbone Coaches Association clinic. He has been invited to give clinics in Wisconsin, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Indiana and Minnesota. For the past 15 years he has worked with former Falcon football player and teammate, Darryl Herrick, at a football clinic in Gilman, Wis. The clinic was established by Herrick, who is the superintendent of the Cedarburg school district, in memory of a nephew who was killed in a hunting accident.

He and wife, Jody, have three children: Lindsey, 24, Jaclyn, 21 and Logan 18. Lindsey, a UW-RF graduate, teaches social studies and coaches volleyball and track & field at the Mauston middle school. Jaclyn is a senior at the University of Minnesota and will graduate in December, 2005 with a degree in film studies. She plans on going to graduate school. Logan will be a freshman at the University of St. Thomas this fall and will compete in cross country and track & field.

PLU 28, UW-RF 24

The Falcon football team played a strong game, but lost 28-24, at Pacific Luther Saturday afternoon.

PLU took the ball first to open the game but on the team's third play from scrimmage a Lutes pass was intercepted by Falcon line-backer Nate Gray giving the Falcons a first down at the PLU 23. Two plays later fullback Nathan Anderson scored on a 22-yard run to give the Falcons a 7-0 lead at 13:32. Spasimir Bodurski kicked the extra point.

PLU took the ensuing kick off and drove 74 yards in 10 plays to tie the game. Ryan Simpson scored the TD on a one-yard run with 9:06 to play in the first quarter.

The Falcons fumbled the ball away on its first play giving PLU a first down at the UWRF 28. Seven plays later Mark McCall scored on a three-yard run to put the Lutes ahead, 14-7.

The Falcons took control of the ball late in the first quarter and finished the drive in the second quarter with a touchdown to tie the game. Halfback John Peterlik scored the TD on a three-yard run with 12:07 to play in the half. UWRF drove 72 yards in nine plays to score. Jeremy Wolff caught a 15-yard pass from Andy Kolstad and he rushed for 14 yards later in the drive.



Falcon linebacker Matt Farmer intercepted a PLU pass to give UWRF the ball at the PLU 40 with 3:38 to play in the half. The Falcons drove to the PLU 21 and lined up for a 38-yard field goal. The attempt was blocked and PLU's Andy Hamilton returned the ball 10 yards before pitching the ball to Alex Jefferies who went 55 yards untouched to give the Lutes a 21-14 lead with :12 to play in the half.

The Falcons took the second half kick off and scored to tie the game, 21-21. Ward picked up five yards on first down and then Peterlik took a pitch 73 yards to the end zone with 14:10 to go in the third quarter.

On the Falcons second drive after the TD, UWRF fumbled the ball away at the PLU 35. The Lutes drove 65 yards in 11 plays to regain
