Psychology Major Curriculum Reorganization (Rev. 3/11/08)

Effective Fall Semester 2008

Consistent with the psychology department planning documents and goals, the psychology faculty has discussed the organization and requirements for the psychology major. Based on our deliberations, consideration of other programs, the perceived needs of our students, and anticipated developments in the field, we have reorganized the courses that are required for the psychology major. The number of required credits remains at 36. With the exception of a course number change (Advanced Research Methods 275-3cr), we are not proposing any new courses. The revised curriculum attempts to ensure students receive a sound background in the traditional areas of psychology, provide some degree of choice within those areas, and encourage the development of research skills. We believe this modification will provide students with course options and also allow the department additional flexibility in course scheduling for our large number of majors. It is our intention to initiate these changes in the fall semester, 2008.

The minor course requirements will remain unchanged. Twenty-four credits are required for the minor program.
