

Remove TED 120 Introduction to Secondary Education from Option I Professional Education course requirements.

Rationale: The content currently presented in TED 120 is already taught in HHP courses. For example, in P ED 161 students start their Chalk & Wire Certification electronic portfolio. In P ED 245, students complete assignments with Excel spreadsheet & learn I-movie technology. In a number of HHP classes (P ED 245, DAN 362, TED 425, 435, P ED 354) students prepare I-movies. Powerpoint presentations are required in a number of HHP classes. Students in P ED 161 spend time in the schools, or complete field-work in their future profession; prepare an initial philosophy statement, autobiography, resume; and learn about the history of education (physical education, health education). Various new computer software (e.g., Inspiration, Kidspiration,) will be presented in P ED 161.

The Teacher Education Department supports the Health and Human Performance Department's request to drop TED 120 from the graduation requirement for teacher certification in the PE major. This is in response to their effort to reduce the credits to degrees in their major.

Change the Adapted Physical Education Minor requirements (see attached).

Rationale: The current Adapted Physical Education program requires 7-8 credits of directed electives plus three pre-requisite classes. Moving the three 'hidden' pre-requisite classes into the required courses and removing the directed electives makes this a much clearer minor.
