Narrative-Proposed Change to the Ethnic Studies Minor

On March 10, 2008, the Ethnic Studies Committee agreed to change our current curriculum as outlined below.

The current curriculum calls for one required course and then allows for several sets of directed electives, including electives in American Ethnicity, electives in Specific Ethnic Groups and courses relating to an Ethnic Heritage (with subgroups including International Ethnicity and courses relevant to the American Ethnic Experience).

As you can see from our proposed curriculum, we would like to reduce and simplify these directed electives to include three (3) main sets-one set focused on the *impact* of being the member of an American Ethnic Groups (9 credits), one set focused on the cultural products or experiences of these American Ethnic Groups (6-9 credits), and a final set focused on the heritage of American Ethnic Groups and International Issues (3-6 credits).

NOTE-the first Set of Electives (focused on the impact of being the member of an American Ethnic Group) contains ONE NEW COURSE-Journalism 315: Race, Class, and News

We have designed it this way for a few reasons: (1) to simplify the minor as well as to (2) focus more attention on the impact or experiences of American Ethnic Group Members and (3) place a slightly lesser focus on the heritage of American Ethnic Group Members and on international issues. We believe that the heritage of these groups and international issues are important, but we would like for our students to get as much coursework as possible in areas that are close to the goals of our program: helping students understand the experiences of American Ethnic Groups and to understand how ethnicity intersects with other factors (gender, class, and religion) across institutions and experiences. The courses focused on the *impact* as well as the cultural *products and experiences* of American Ethnic Groups would seem to support those goals quite well, with heritage and international courses playing a more supporting role.
